Benevolence of the Fraternal Organizations

America has a rich history of organizations which help, aid and assist those in their communities. These would include churches, civic groups (like the Lions, Elks and Kiwanis) and fraternal organizations (like the Masons, Odd Fellows and the Grange). These organizations may have a national presence, but most provide assistance on a very local level. Scottish economist, Adam Smith (1723-1790), was impressed by the magnitude of impact that these organizations could have on their local communities – and dubbed it “the invisible hand”, in that these organizations, mostly without fanfare, would build libraries, hospitals and otherwise contribute to the welfare of others through service and monetary donations and did so without government intervention.

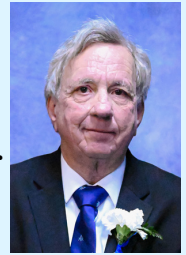
In addition to the charitable support of the local community, the fraternal organizations had a charitable impact on their own memberships. The Modern Woodmen Fraternity (c1880), which adopted the working tools of lumberjacks much like we adopted the tools of stone masons, provided a generous insurance program – which has outlasted the fraternity itself. In the case of Freemasonry, these would include direct assistance to worthy, distressed Brother Masons from the Lodge, or assistance from the Grand Lodge; or scholarship opportunities for the members and their families. Many jurisdictions even have retirement homes and long-term care facilities to support their members as they age. It is comforting to know there is a safety net for the Brothers and their families, but it should not be seen as main reason to join the fraternity. Back in the 1700-1800's, Lodges would print notices in the local newspaper when they observed “Masons” going from lodge to lodge seeking financial assistance. This was a safeguard from the charlatans who were violating the Master Mason obligation of never committing fraud or deceit on fellow Brother Masons.

Our Lodge is here to support the Brothers and their families. We also do our best for the Grand Lodge of Florida through donations; and to the Florida Masonic Home through donations (like our recent support of the quilts project) and the “Let Your Pennies Make Good Cents” contributions. These actions ensure that our Fraternity will be there to assist those in need into the future. Thank you for continued generosity, Brothers!

Chaplains Corner



Brothers of Saint Cloud Lodge,

Happy Birthday to our country. What a ride so far. Hope you enjoyed all the celebrations that were on tv across the country. In 1976 the 200th birthday, I was 27 years old and married for 4 months and living in Baltimore.

The big celebration then was the Tall Ships sailing into the Baltimore Harbor and fireworks. Nothing like the sail in and fly over in New York. How much as change in 50 years.

Living in the Annapolis area most of my life, the Navy and the Naval Academy are very important to me. Because of that and the 250th birthday of our county, my thoughts for this month is on BROTHER JOHN PAUL JONES, the father of the American Navy. His famous quote is "I have not yet begun to fight."

Brother Jones was born in Scotland in 1747. His connection with the sea began at the age of 13 when he left Northern England as an apprentice aboard a ship called Friendship. On June 14, 1777 Brother John Paul Jones assumed command of the flag ship Ranger. His orders were to sail to France and assist the American cause.

On September 23, 1779 commanding a squadron of 5 ships he defeated the a British merchant convoy. After the Revolution was over Brother Jones remained in France. He died in Paris in 1792 at the age of 45 years.

Brother Jones was initiated as a brother in 1770 at Saint Bernard's lodge in Kirkcudbright, Scotland in the order of Ancient Accepted Scottish Rite before the revolution began.

He received his Fellowcraft and Master Mason degrees in Royal White Heart Lodge in Halifax, North Carolina.

After his death in 1792 he was laid to rest in Saint Louis Cemetery in Paris. His body remained there for more than a century. The American Ambassador to France located his remains and in April 1905 his body was returned to America his new home. The US Navy transported the body of Brother Jones back to Annapolis, Maryland aboard the USS BROOKLYN accompanied by 3 other ships as an honor guard. He was then interned in Bancroft Hall at the US Naval Academy on April 24, 1906. The ceremony was led by President Theodore Roosevelt also a Freemason. Then on January 26, 1913 Brother Jones remains were moved for the last time below the Naval Academy Chapel. On April 24, 2016 John Paul Jones' story becomes personal to me as a Mason. The Grand Lodge of Maryland came to the Annapolis Lodge. Over 200 Masons, me included, marched down Main Street side by side onto the Naval Academy and into Bancroft Hall for his Masonic Memorial Service.

If you're ever in Maryland, visit his grave and the Annapolis lodge. Both great pieces of American and Masonic history.

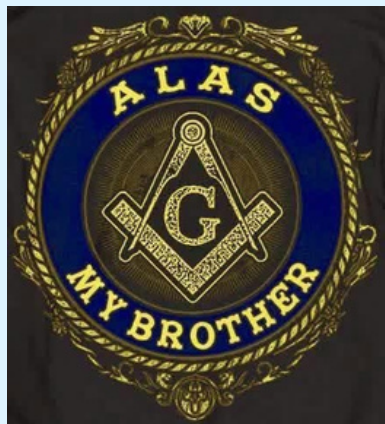

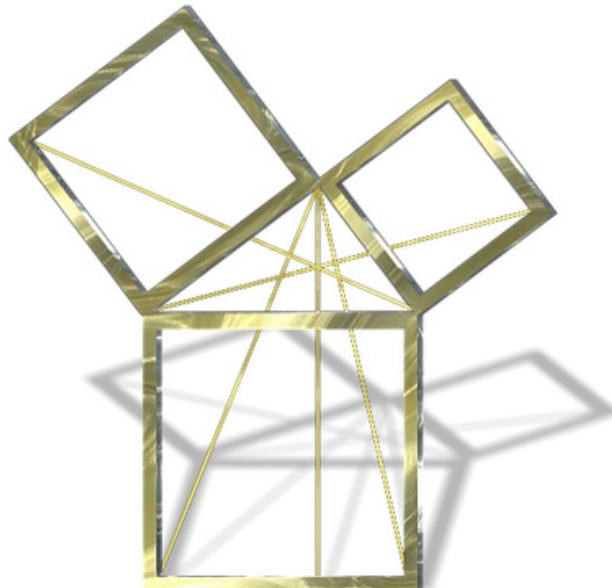

Famous Mason of the Month

John Archer Lejeune

Lieutenant General John Archer Lejeune was a celebrated U.S. Marine Corps leader who earned the Army Distinguished Service Medal, Navy Distinguished Service Medal, and French Legion of Honor. He served as the 13th Commandant of the Marine Corps and commanded the 2nd Infantry Division in World War I.

Military Career Highlights

- Served in the U.S. Marine Corps from 1890 to 1929.
- Commanded the Army's 2nd Infantry Division in France during World War I, a rare feat for a Marine officer.
- Acted as Commandant of the Marine Corps from 1920 to 1929, shaping the modern corps.
- Created the foundation for the Marine Corps' modern amphibious warfare doctrine.

Major Awards and Honors

- Navy Distinguished Service Medal: Awarded for exceptional service during World War I.
- Army Distinguished Service Medal: Awarded by the U.S. Army for his command of the 2nd Infantry Division.
- French Legion of Honor (Commander): Awarded by the French government for military bravery.
- French Croix de Guerre: Received with palm clusters for heroism in combat.

Lieutenant General John Archer Lejeune was a devoted Freemason whose Masonic record includes joining Overseas Lodge No. 1 in Coblenz, Germany, affiliating with Alexandria Lodge No. 22 in Virginia, and attaining the 33° Scottish Rite.

Masonic Affiliations and Milestones

- **Blue Lodge:** Initiated in 1919 at Overseas Lodge No. 1 in Coblenz, Germany (later moved to Providence, Rhode Island, and renamed Overseas Lodge No. 40); later affiliated with Alexandria Lodge No. 22 in Virginia.
- **Scottish Rite:** Advanced through the Scottish Rite bodies in Washington, D.C., in the early 1920s, eventually reaching the 33rd Degree.
- **Shrine:** Joined the Shrine in Washington, D.C., during the early 1920s.
- **Namesake Lodge:** Honored by fellow Marines and Masons who established the John A. Lejeune Lodge No. 350 in Quantico, Virginia, chartered in February 1925.

Kilwinning Lodge No. 0

Lodge Mother Kilwinning No. 0 is widely regarded as one of the oldest Masonic lodges in existence, with traditions tracing back to the medieval guild of operative stonemasons. These early craftsmen traveled widely and relied on secret signs and words to prove their skills and rank. Over time, the lodge evolved from an operative guild into a speculative Masonic body, admitting non-craftsmen beginning in the sixteenth century.

Kilwinning's Masonic heritage is closely tied to the Abbey of Kilwinning, traditionally dated to around 1140. According to long-held tradition, skilled masons from Italy were brought to Scotland to build the abbey and established a formal lodge within its Chapterhouse. Numerous mason marks still visible on the abbey ruins support its early connection to the craft. Although the lodge's earliest records were lost—likely during the Reformation or a later fire—its antiquity is supported by early charters, including one establishing the Lodge of Scoon and Bertha in the late twelfth century.

For centuries, Scottish kings served as Grand Masters or appointed deputies to oversee the craft. The powerful St. Clair family held the hereditary title until 1736, when the Grand Lodge of Scotland was formed. Mother Kilwinning initially participated but withdrew when it was ranked second rather than first. From 1744 to 1807, it operated independently and issued its own charters across Scotland and abroad. Reconciliation in 1807 brought Mother Kilwinning back into the Grand Lodge—under the special and unprecedented designation “No. 0.” This number reflects its status as the oldest and foundational lodge in Scotland, placed above the numerical roll rather than within it.

Today, Mother Kilwinning remains a symbol of Masonic heritage, known for its historic artifacts, international influence, and centuries-long role in public ceremonies and civic life.

Food For Thought

The numbers 3, 5, and 7 are progressive stages of moral and intellectual instruction encountered during the Fellow Craft degree ceremony:

3 (Three steps) Symbolizes the three principal officers of a lodge and the three stages of human life (youth, manhood, and old age). It represents a moral foundation, discipline, and devotion to learning.

5 (Five steps) Refers to the five human senses (by which man apprehends the world), the five points of fellowship, and the five orders of architecture. It signifies the disciplined growth of the mind and the training of human faculties.

7 (Seven steps) Represents completeness and the seven liberal arts and sciences (grammar, rhetoric, logic, arithmetic, geometry, music, and astronomy). This final set of steps leads to the culmination of knowledge and wisdom in the "Middle Chamber".
